



through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. Amen.






# **EPIPHANY**

The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the light of Christ shining into the world. In Western Christian churches, Epiphany is marked with the arrival of the Magi from the East. These strange, foreign, pagan philosophers follow the light of a star to Bethlehem where they encounter the light of the world, Jesus. In Epiphany we remember that God's light shines out in new and surprising ways and places because of the birth of Jesus.

Following Evensong, we will participate in two Epiphany related celebrations. First, we will be chalking the front door of the church and providing you with blessed chalk to repeat this fun ceremony at home. Traditionally, the chalking is done above the lintel where this is written: 20+C+M+B+25 - The letters are the abbreviation for the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" - "Christ bless this house" (A second meaning and mnemonic device is Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar traditional names for the Magi). The + signs represent the cross, and 20-25 is the year. (From The Book of Occasional Services.)

By blessing the entrance of the church and/or house, we proclaim that the light of Christ shines in this place. This old tradition reminds us that just as the holy family welcomed the Magi to bless Christ, we should also extend hospitality to all who come into our homes trusting that they will experience the light of Christ there. We bless our homes to become places of blessing for all who enter.

In addition, after the chalking of the church door, we will burn the Christmas greens. While this tradition is typically celebrated on the twelfth night of Christmas, it is fitting to celebrate the light of Christ entering the world by creating a little light ourselves with some fun (and safe) fire in our celebration of Epiphany.
