The Old Testament

Exodus 12:1-14a

<sup>1</sup> The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, <sup>2</sup> “This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. <sup>3</sup> Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers’ houses, a lamb for a household. <sup>4</sup> And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb.

<sup>5</sup> Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, <sup>6</sup> and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight.

<sup>7</sup> “Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. <sup>8</sup> They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. <sup>9</sup> Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts. <sup>10</sup> And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. <sup>11</sup> In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord’s Passover. <sup>12</sup> For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord. <sup>13</sup> The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

Luke 22:14-30

Do this in remembrance of me." <sup>20</sup> And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood. <sup>21</sup> But behold, the hand

of him who betrays me is with me on the table. <sup>22</sup> For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom he is betrayed!” <sup>23</sup> And they began to question one another, which of them it could be who was going to do this.



Celebrant: Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

## TODAY'S MUSICAL OFFERING

Tonight, Maundy Thursday, we commemorate the institution of the sacramental rite of Holy Communion and the great sacrificial love of God. At the Prelude, we hear the mystic music of 20th Century French composer Olivier Messiaen in a depiction of John 6:56 "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." Listen for the blood drops of Christ which begin in a regular pattern and then taper off to nothing as Christ dies on the cross.

The sequence hymn, "Now my tongue, the mystery telling," ranks as one of the truly great Eucharistic hymns of the Church. With a text attributed to St. Thomas Aquinas, it is sung to an old medieval Sarum plainsong tune. At the Offertory we hear Harold Friedell's anthem of supplication, "Jesus, so lowly." The simple, meditative quality of this work has earned it a beloved place in the American Anglican choral repertoire. The text is the only widely known poem by Edith Williams, the sister of poet, novelist, theologian, and scholar Charles Williams. In it she speaks of "Jesus, so lowly, child of the earth; Jesus, so lonely and sad; Jesus, so broken"; and finally, "Jesus, victorious, mighty and free." The poem culminates in the triumphant concluding phrase "teach me how glorious death is to be." During the Ministration the choir sings yet another significant Eucharistic hymn of the Church, "Ave Verum" in a setting by English composer Edward Elgar.

After the Eucharist is celebrated on Maundy Thursday, it is customary to "strip the altar," symbolizing the abandonment of Jesus by his disciples and the stripping of Jesus by the soldiers before his crucifixion. Psalm 22 is traditionally sung during this time preceded and followed by the antiphon "They divided my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing."
