

The Epistle 2 Timothy 2:8-15

<sup>8</sup>Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, the offspring of David, as preached in my gospel, <sup>9</sup>for which I am suffering, bound with chains as a criminal. But the word of God is not bound! <sup>10</sup>Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory. <sup>11</sup>The saying is trustworthy, for:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he also will deny us;

if we are faithless, he remains faithful—

for he cannot deny himself.

<sup>14</sup>Remind them of these things, and charge them before God not to quarrel about words, which does no good, but only ruins the hearers. <sup>15</sup>Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth.



The Gospel Luke 17:11-19

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

<sup>11</sup>On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. <sup>12</sup>And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance <sup>13</sup>and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." <sup>14</sup>When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. <sup>15</sup>Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; <sup>16</sup>and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. <sup>17</sup>Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? <sup>18</sup>Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" <sup>19</sup>And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

### THE NICENE CREED Congregation stands.

**BCP 358** 

We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate:

he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Celebrant: Let us pray for the Church and for the world.

Congregation kneels.

Leader: Father, we pray for your holy catholic Church;

*People:* That we all may be one.

Leader: Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you;

People: That your Name may be glorified by all people.

Leader: We pray for this community, the nation, and the world, especially our

ministry partners at Generation One;

*People:* That all may work for justice, freedom, and peace.

Leader: We pray for all bishops, priests, and deacons;

*People:* That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.

Leader: We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world;

*People:* That there may be justice and peace on the earth.

Leader: Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

*People:* That our works may find favor in your sight.

Leader: Have compassion on Meredith, John, Sally, Lisa, Bruce, Karen, Cynthia, Scott,

Zoe, Michelle, Andy, Ellen, Pat, Judy, Sam, Austin, Susan, Martha, Matthew,

George, and all those who suffer from any grief or trouble;

*People:* That they may be delivered from their distress.

Leader: Give to the departed, especially Milan Dimitrijevic, eternal rest;

*People:* Let light perpetual shine upon them.

Leader: We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

*People:* May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.

Leader: Let us pray for our own needs and those of others, especially, we pray this

week, October 12–19, for our partner Diocese of Kondoa in Tanzania as they begin an eight-day evangelism campaign to reach 5,000 souls for Christ. May God provide all the resources and strength they need, for nothing is

impossible with God.

The people may add their own petitions.

The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.

Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy

Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.



Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give

thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord; who on the first day of the week overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



Congregation kneels.

Celebrant: We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

People and Celebrant:

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

Celebrant: And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. Amen.







Celebrant:



to love and serve you



The curriculum is from the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* which provides the children with a deeper understanding of the sacrament of Holy Communion and the opportunity to grow in their faith.

#### TODAY'S MUSICAL OFFERING

Today's musical offerings include provocative settings of two Latin hymns, *Tantum ergo* and *Ubi caritas*. *Tatum ergo* is the last two stanzas from the Eucharistic Hymn *Pange Lingua* by Thomas Aquinas that we sing in procession on Maundy Thursday. It is the asterisked verses of Hymn 329. The hymn is also sung in Anglo-Catholic parishes at Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The choral setting sung at the Offertory is by 19<sup>th</sup> Century French organist Charles-Marie Widor, featuring a soaring melody sung throughout by the baritones of the choir.

The Gregorian hymn, *Ubi caritas* (Where charity and love is, God is there), has long been used as one of the antiphons sung during the washing of feet on Maundy Thursday. At the Ministration, we hear a contemporary, ethereal setting of this hymn by composer and organist, David Briggs. Like the famous setting by French composer Maurice Duruflé, the plainsong melody is sung in the alto part.
